

### Course Summary

The course provides a comprehensive exploration of migration, displacement, and migrant and refugee rights. It integrates theoretical frameworks with practical case studies, covering global migration trends, legal frameworks, human rights, and the socio-economic impacts of displacement. Key topics include migration theories, mobility rights, evolving legal protections, and policies supporting refugee livelihoods and integration.

The course also examines human rights violations, such as forced disappearances, and strategic litigation for migrant families. A specific focus is given to Lebanon, including the Syrian refugee crisis and state policies. By the end, students will gain a deep understanding of migration, displacement, and global governance.
